Day 1Mar 13**

Honolulu → Kansai – Osaka

We begin our journey by boarding an international flight to Kansai Airport, the gateway city to Osaka. Meals and snacks will be served on the plane to ensure a comfortable trip.

Day 2Mar 14**

Osaka

Upon arrival at Kansai International Airport, an Air & Sea Travel representative will greet us and escort us to our hotel in Osaka.

Day 3Mar 15**

Day Trip in Kyoto

(B, L, D)

After breakfast, we will transfer to **Kyoto** for a full-day trip. Kyoto, the former Imperial capital of Japan for over a thousand years, is rich in history and culture. Our first stop is **Fushimi Inari Shrine**, built to honor Inari, the Shinto god of rice. The main shrine structure was completed in 1499. At the base of the hill, we'll find the main gate (rōmon, or "tower gate") and the main shrine (go-honden). As we ascend, a path lined with thousands of vibrant torii gates leads to the inner shrine. Following our visit, we'll enjoy lunch at a local restaurant. We will then experience **Kyo-Yuzen**, a unique dyeing technique developed in the late Edo era (17th century), celebrated for its vivid colors and intricate designs used in kimono making. We'll have the opportunity to **dye a tote bag** using this traditional method. Our day continues at **Kiyomizu-dera**, an independent Buddhist temple in Eastern Kyoto and a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**. The view from the main hall, overlooking the hillside adorned with cherry blossoms, is truly breathtaking. Nearby, the charming pedestrian lanes of **Ninen-zaka** and **Sannen-zaka** (Two-Year Hill and Three-Year Hill) offer a glimpse into pre-modern Kyoto, lined with traditional buildings and shops. After our tour, we will transfer back to Osaka and enjoy dinner together.

Day 4Mar 16**

Osaka – Nara – Osaka

(B, L)

After breakfast, we will transfer to **Nara**. **Nara Park**, designated as one of the "Places of Scenic Beauty" by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), is home to over 1,200 wild Sika Deer that roam freely. These deer have become a symbol of the city and are considered a natural treasure. Next, we will visit **Todaiji**, also known as the Great Eastern Temple, one of Japan's most famous and historically significant temples. Its main hall, the Daibutsuden (Big Buddha Hall), is the world's largest wooden building, although the current reconstruction from 1692 is only two-thirds the size of the original temple. After enjoying a local lunch, we will return to Osaka for a city tour. As Japan's third-largest and second-most important city, Osaka has been an economic powerhouse for centuries. Our first stop will be **Osaka Castle**, where we can explore the **Castle Tower**, which houses an informative museum about the castle's history and Toyotomi Hideyoshi. This castle was the largest of its time. Following our castle visit, we'll head to **Shinsaibashi**, the largest and most renowned shopping area in Osaka. This vibrant district, which evolved from the arcaded **Shinsaibashi Shopping Street**, has a history of 380 years and was already an established shopping hub during the Edo Period. The street features a 600-meter long covered arcade lined with shops of all kinds, catering to all ages. Next, we'll visit **Dōtonbori**, another major tourist destination in Osaka. One of its most iconic landmarks is "The Glico Man," a billboard for the confectionery company Glico, depicting a runner crossing the finish line—an emblematic symbol of Osaka. We can enjoy dinner at one of the many eateries on this lively street. Afterward, we'll take a leisurely walk back to our hotel.

Day 5Mar 17****Osaka  Tokyo****(B)**

After breakfast, we will transfer to Shin Osaka Train Station to board the **Bullet Train** to Tokyo Station. During the ride, you can experience local culture by enjoying a train bento box for lunch on your own. **Tokyo**, the capital city of Japan, is one of the most populous metropolitan areas in the world. Upon arrival, we will transfer to the hotel, and you'll have the opportunity to explore the city at your leisure.

Day 6Mar 18****Tokyo****(B, D)**

After breakfast, we will visit **Senso-ji**, an ancient Buddhist temple located in Asakusa. As Tokyo's oldest and one of its most significant temples, Senso-ji is dedicated to the bodhisattva Kannon. Dominating the entrance is the Kaminarimon, or "Thunder Gate," an imposing structure featuring a massive paper lantern painted in vivid red and black to evoke thunderclouds and lightning. Beyond the Kaminarimon lies Nakamise-dori, lined with shops, followed by the Hōzōmon, or "Treasure House Gate," which provides access to the inner complex. The surrounding area boasts many traditional shops and eateries offering local dishes such as hand-made noodles, sushi, and tempura, continuing the age-old tradition of catering to pilgrims who visit Senso-ji. We can enjoy lunch here at our leisure. In the afternoon, we will visit **Ueno Zoological Gardens**, the oldest zoo in Japan, home to over 3,000 animals from 400 different species. One of the highlights of our visit will be the opportunity to see the giant panda. Afterward, we'll take a stroll to **Ueno Park**, a beautiful spot for cherry blossom viewing, weather permitting. In the evening, we will gather for our dinner before returning to our hotel.

Day 7Mar 19****Tokyo****(B)**

After breakfast, enjoy a full leisure day to shop around the city and eat whatever looks interesting. "Shop till you drop; eat till you overflow!" There are a lot of shopping districts in Tokyo, Shinjuku, Shibuya, or Tokyo Solamachi (base of the Tokyo sky tree). You can also visit **Tokyo DisneySea** or **Tokyo Disneyland** on your own (estimate additional cost of USD80.00, subject to change until confirmation). You will find a unique Japanese style of Disneyland.

Day 8Mar 20****Tokyo – Narita → Honolulu****(B)**

After breakfast, we will visit **Tsukiji Market**, the largest wholesale market for fresh fish, fruits, and vegetables in central Tokyo. With over ten warehouses serving as distribution centers for food products, Tsukiji handles 2,000 tons of marine products daily, making it one of the world's largest fish markets. We will enjoy our own lunch here. Following our visit to the market, we will head to **Shinjuku Gyoen**, a beautiful park originally created as a garden for the Imperial Household. It is renowned for cherry blossom viewing in March and April, offering a stunning display of flowers. After taking in the beauty of the blossoms, we will transfer to the airport for our return flight to Honolulu, carrying with us the lasting memories of this wonderful Spring Break trip to Osaka and Tokyo.
